Brief Commentary;

In a week of market instability the Australian dollar has been as low as 0.5571 and finished today at 0.6007 (almost to the same point as last weeks report)

Imported soybean meal reached a recent high price of \$830 and finished today at \$805/mt ex brisbane.

The large increases in soybean meal price from last week has been driven partly by the AU\$/exchange rate but also volatility in world market prices

Increases in soybean price and a weakened dollar has driven increased pricing for alternative protein meals including canola and dried distiller grains

Despite some rises, canola meal (solvent) remains priced at a discount per unit of protein relative to other protein meals.

Imported drought-like feeds continue to see very low demand and sales but despite these normally negative forces the prices have remained steady

Significant market variability remains with different traders selling at significantly different prices, reflecting their needs to reduce stock positions and therefore offer prices less than that listed

Commodities highlighted in blue have price ranges of \$10-30/mt up or down from the published price included in the table

Despite increased closures of businesses and the state borders due to COVID-19 there has been no recorded interruptions to domestic "essential services" such as freight and farm commodity inputs

However, some end users have taken extra physical positions of key inputs in an attempt to mitigate against potential future supply disruptions
